Violence Against Nurses Bill A3103/S4018

<ul> <li>Nurses are often first to interact with individuals or groups in injured and excited states, which exposes them to greater risk of violence than many in other professions. While nurses are trained with a minimum competency to interact with individuals in various situations, intervention in a potentially violent situation is not often part of that specialized training.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Individual nurses have very little influence over the level of violence or the safeguards in their workplaces. Gang members, drug or alcohol abusers, trauma patients, mentally ill patients, and distraught family members are often present and have unrestricted movement through facilities.</li> </ul>
This is unsafe for patients and nurses. When nurses are assaulted, they are taken away from direct patient care. The gap created in staffing when one nurse is assaulted places a heavier burden on the remaining nurses and exacerbates an environment of delays, errors, poorer quality care, and frustrations that may further the potential for additional assaults.
Please ask your leadership to bring this bill to the floor for a vote this session so that nurses can provide patient care in a safer work environment.
